A Gift From Julia

A LOVING LEGACY THAT WILL CHANGE LIVES

My wife Julia and I used to joke about growing old, sitting in our rocking chairs yelling at people who drove too fast down the street. We chuckled at the idea of a life like that.

I never imagined a future with her not being in it.

I had just summited Mount Kilimanjaro in Africa, a lifelong dream, when I got the news: Julia had leukemia. I raced back home to be by her side as she started chemotherapy.

At 35 years of age, Julia received a stem cell transplant from her sister, hoping it would buy her enough time for better treatments to come along. From research we'd done about her type of leukemia, we knew that she had less than a 10% chance of celebrating her 40th birthday.

Julia was curious and always asked questions. One of her doctors described how she was looking to start a clinical trial at The Ottawa Hospital to offer breakthroughs in leukemia treatment using CAR T-cell therapies. The first big gamechanger to leukemia treatment in more than 20 years!



When Julia's leukemia came back 11 months after her transplant, she knew exactly what she wanted to do. She would leave a gift upon her death to The Ottawa Hospital.

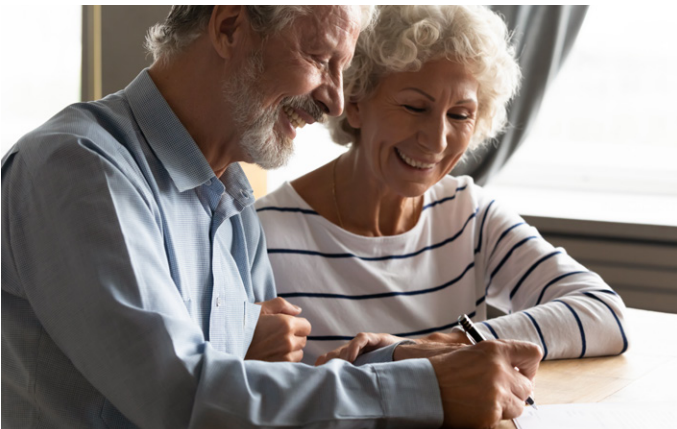
Her last act would support vital research, today and into the future. We decided on a blended gift: a donation in Julia's name now from life insurance proceeds, with the rest of our gift to be given when I die. This would ensure there would be enough money to both give back and raise our youngest.

I feel peaceful knowing a gift is in my will. I know what it's like to be widowed, to watch our daughter lose a parent.

If I can prevent another family from going through that, my legacy is complete.

How Do I Make A Gift In My Will?



What types of gift can I make in my will?

Most people opt to make one of two types of gifts: residual or fixed sum.

A residual gift allows you to give a share or a percentage of whatever is leftover in your estate to charity. With a fixed sum gift, you choose a specific amount to donate.

The type of gift you elect to make is a deeply personal choice.

There are just a few pieces of information you need to leave a gift in your will to The Ottawa Hospital.

This applies if you're making a will for the first time, or drafting a codicil to attach to an existing will.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a will?

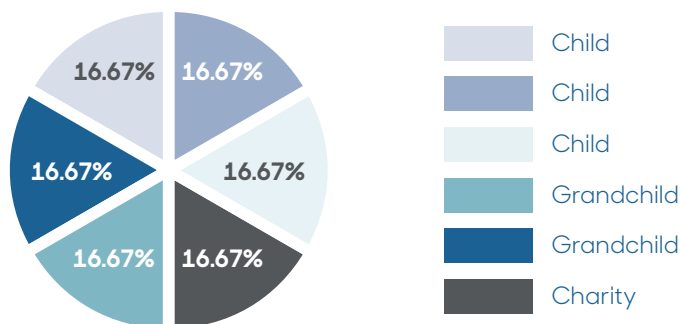
A will is a legal document that lets you decide what happens to your money, property, and possessions after your death.

Who can leave a gift in their will?

Anyone! Nearly 1.5 million Canadians have left a gift to charity in their will. A gift in your will is your final opportunity to make a lasting gift to a cause you care about.

How can I leave a gift in my will and still provide for my loved ones?

One way to think about this is to divide up your estate into percentages. For a moment, think of your will like a pie. You can choose to leave a slice to each of your children, another to your grandchildren, and another to a cause you care deeply about.



What if I already have a will?

You can certainly include The Ottawa Hospital in your will, even if it's already been written. You can use a legal document called a codicil to update your will at any time.

Do I have to let you know about my decision?

You're under no obligation to share that you've left a gift in your will with us. If you do choose to communicate that you've included The Ottawa Hospital in your will, it enables us to plan much more effectively for the future. More importantly, it gives us the opportunity to thank you personally for your commitment to healthcare and to ensure that your legacy is never forgotten.

You may have no idea how much leaving a gift in your will to charity could affect the amount of tax you pay to the government on your estate.
